

CAMP SITES ARE CROWDED

With tourists flocking through Albany to the Adirondacks by the thousands, the state conservation commission today revealed that all records for use of the state camp sites are being shattered.

Between July 4 and July 6 the 15 forest preserve camp sites were used by 36,297 persons, the conservation department reports.

The largest registration was at the Hearthstone Point camp site on Lake George, where 4,363 campers were accommodated. Caroga Lake was a close second with 3,884 campers and picnickers. Other camps reported as follows:

Lake George battlefield, 2,025; Eagle Point, 815; Sharp Bridge, 1,410; Wilmington Notch, 926; Meadowbrook, 737; Fish Creek Pond, 2,723; Lake Eaton, 686; Lewey Lake, 562; Crown Point reservation, 1,207; Poplar Point, 3,245; Sacandaga, 1,933; Third Lake creek, 433, and Beaverkill, 1,358.

Reports from all parts of the Adirondacks indicate that tourists are passing through in greater numbers than ever before, some bound for Canada and some for points in the mountains. Thousands of visitors have come from other states.
