## TRANSFER STATION PERMITS

Required to access the station located at: 232 Everson Road, Johnstown 518-835-2482

#### Permits are purchased at the Town Clerk's Office.

They begin on April 1 and expire on March 31 of the next year.

Cars: \$15 • Truck or 5x8 Trailer: \$35 • Temporary Permit: \$20 for 3 trips in & do not expire.

To dispose of an appliance, permits are \$5 each for a hot water tank, washer, dryer, dishwasher, stove or furnace/wood stove.

There is a \$2 cost to replace a transfer station permit.



#### CAROGA PROPERTY RENTERS

Local Law #1 of 2024 was adopted on March 13,2024. All Caroga property owners **MUST** have a valid permit to rent any dwelling unit in whole or part to any person, persons, or entity for a period of less than 30 consecutive nights. Applications are on the town website Caroga.town or available from the Code Enforcement Officer.

## TOWN OF CAROGA CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICE

Building Permits are Required for All Projects except Painting.

When we inspect your project, it protects you and your contractor by ensuring that your project is completed properly and safely. <u>Any Building or renovations being done without a permit shall pay double the price of the permit.</u> Contact the code officer at 518-835-4211 ext 102 Cell 518-496-6204 or at codeenforcement@caroga.town.

Building Permits may be renewed for the same cost as the original, if renewed before the expiration date. There is a one-year limit on renewing permits.

Working without a Building Permit is a fineable offense of \$250.00, plus double the cost of the building permit(s).

**Variances** - Some building projects may require a variance to existing land use regulations or the local zoning ordinance. Reviews for lot line amendments, subdivisions, Planning Board and/or Zoning Board of Appeals reviews for variances to land use or zoning requirements \$250 per Board.

**Solar System Installations:** Manufactures specifications and a third-party electrical inspection are required.

**Swimming Pools:** Require a third-party electrical inspection and barriers (fences) that meet building code requirements.

**Temporary Structure:** <u>Valid for six months</u> – Mainly used for storage while renovations are taking place.

**Wells:** need surveyed site plan. Meeting Department of Health setbacks from other wells and sanitation systems.

#### JUNK AND INOPERABLE VEHICLES:

No individual junk or inoperable motorized vehicles may be located on any parcel that is visible from public roads, trails, boat or canoe water ways.

Junk & Debris. Local Law #2-2009 & The NYS Fire Prevention & Building Codes Section 302.8.

New York State Law prohibits plow operators from depositing snow on or across any State, County, or Local Highway.

Local Law1-2014 Prohibits parking from October 1st through April 1st on ALL Town and County streets and Highways in order to facilitate snow removal.



# CAROGA SNOWMOBILERS

**Snowmobile Legislation Effective 2/27/2006:** No person under the age of 14 shall operate a snowmobile except upon land owned or leased by his or her parent or guardian. Leased lands shall not include lands leased by an organization of which said owner or parent is a member.

A person 10 or older but less than 14 who holds a valid snowmobile safety certificate may operate on any lands snowmobiling is allowed if accompanied by a person over 18. A person 14 or older but less than 18 who either holds a safety certificate or is accompanied by a person over 18 may operate a snowmobile in the same manner as a person over eighteen years of age. ### **Amanda's Law**

"A Law Regulating Ice Shanties in the Town of Caroga."

The Purpose of this Local Law is to contribute to the safety of all who recreate or traverse the frozen lake waters within the Town of Caroga during Ice Fishing Season. Ice Shanties placed upon any waters located in the Town of Caroga must display a minimum of 48 running inches of 3-inch-wide reflective tape or 1 Square foot of reflective surface on each side of the shanty. The reflective surface shall not block the required New York State identification requirements. Owners of shanties found without reflective material shall be subject to a fine of up to \$50.00.

All Shanties must be off ALL waters in New York by March 15

# **DRIVING IN CAROGA**

According to NYS Dept of Motor Vehicles – mini bikes, off road motorcycle, side by sides, go carts and GOLF CARTS can't be driven on state or local highways. Some types of low speed vehicles that look similar to a golf cart can be registered for the road but must meet federal motor vehicles safety standards. They must have upgraded brakes, head and tail lights, turn signals, brake lights, reflectors, mirrors, horn, a windshield and seatbelts.

Currently ATV"s are not allowed on any roads throughout the Town.



# **Special Notice for Boaters**

in the Town of Caroga and Live within Ten Miles of the Adirondack Park Blue Line

All water craft launched in the Adirondacks are required to be free from aquatic invasive species. New York State DEC Regulation (6 NYCRR Part 576) states that:

No person shall launch, or attempt to launch, a watercraft or floating dock into a public water body unless the following reasonable precautions of cleaning, draining, and treating have been taken.

In addition, effective June 8, 2022 the Environmental Conservation Law now requires that all boaters operating any kind of motorized watercraft in the Adirondack Park and within ten miles of the Blue Line also possess special certification that, before launching, their vessel has undergone measures to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species by following the Clean, Drained, and Dry. standards described in NYS Regulation (6 NYCRR Part 576).

To obtain a certificate you can go on-line or visit the Caroga Town Clerk's Office on State Highway 10 in Caroga Lake, the Town Boat Decontamination Station across the street from the Town Hall, the DEC Boat Launch at West Lake, and the boat launch at DEC's East Caroga Campsite. They are also available at other DEC designated aquatic invasive species inspection stations where boat stewards are present to inspect or decontaminate vessels and to provide boaters with a certification card.

Alternately, boaters may perform Clean, Drained, and Dry steps themselves and then complete a self-issued certificate. A Self-Issued Certificate is available below to be printed and carried by boaters.

# **Examples of AIS in NY**

#### Water chestnut



- Fan-shaped leaves with toothed edges
- Sharp-edged seeds can cut feet
- Dense floating mats impede boating, fishing, and swimming




- Tiny striped ovalor D-shaped shells
- Can cover hard surfaces like docks and mooring lines
- Shells can cut feet

#### Eurasian watermilfoil



- 4-6 feathery leaves around stem, blunt-tipped, as if snipped off
- New plants sprout from fragments
- Dense plant growth impedes boating, fishing, and swimming

#### Spiny waterflea



- Tiny crustacean with long, barbed tail
- Competes with small fish for food
- Can clog guides of fishing rods

#### Hydrilla

4-8 blade-like leaves with slightly toothed edges around stem

Dense plant growth impedes boating, fishing, and swimming

Tolerates both fresh and brackish water
